


This mountainside retreat designed by **BHH Partners** and built by **Pinnacle Mountain Homes** is perched high in the Eagles Nest neighborhood of Silverthorne, Colorado. A visually striking element to this modern home is its butterfly roof, which folds into itself — not to mention the Williams Fork ridgeline that serves as a dramatic backdrop.

Despite the cold metal and glass industrial elements that typically define mountain modern homes, this one infuses warmer organic elements, such as walnut and stone. You will also find seamless indoor-outdoor transitions in this 4,100 square foot five-bedroom, three-and-a-half-bath dwelling. The contemporary design blends modern lines, natural materials, unexpected angles and the softness of natural light.

Nineteen-foot-tall windows border a blended living, dining, and kitchen space and extend into the landscape to provide a unique architectural focal point with an equally impressive backdrop. Since this home was constructed on a steeply sloping site, the project team spread the house out over three levels. The homeowners opted for an elevator in the center of the home, this way they would be able to retire in this home.



Designed with entertaining in mind, this three-level home features three master suites, a custom wet bar, and a main-level wine cellar. Bi-fold glass doors set a delible boundary between the dining room and deck for a seamless extension of space and convenient access to the custom patinaed-steel pizza oven.
